- To carry out activities ancillary and incidental to the above charitable purposes.

Healthy Youth Network uses Search Institute's Developmental Assets Framework to guide our work, focus our efforts and evaluate outcomes. We follow Search Institute's Developmental Relationship Framework to guide our interactions with youth and effectively engage them. By embedding assets & relationships in young people's lives, we improve mental health, reduce at-risk behaviour, and create better outcomes.

n behalf of the Board of Directors of the Healthy Youth Network, we are pleased to celebrate another year of helping youth flourish. The staff and volunteers of this organization are highly committed to positive youth outcomes through the various program and event offerings.

And finally, a huge Thank You to our Executive Director/Program Manager, Penny Deathe, for her tireless advocacy and dedication to young people reaching their potential. Penny has much valued help with our community partners, donors & funders, and our volunteers on the Board of Directors, Senior Leadership Team, Youth Impact Team, What's Your Path Team, Flamborough Challenge Team and the HEART team. Message from the Executive Director

f 20/21 was the year we began to build the box for Healthy Youth Network, 21/22 was the year we began to fill that box. Although we still felt the effects of Covid with schools only beginning to open, we found ways to move forward thanks to the dedication of our teams and support of our partners.

To start the fiscal year, we received funding for Women and Gender Equality Canada to develop an ally program to combat gender-based violence in our schools. We recruited a student team and began to meet weekly. With schools closed, or limiting visitors, our team met at the Youth Unlimited Youth Centre. We hired Clarity Creative, a consulting firm who had helped us determine what the future of What's Your Path looked like. Through the spring of 2022, they helped the student team develop a framework, which resulted in renaming themselves HEART (Healthy Education About Relationships Team). This resonated so well with students and the school, that in September we launched HEART at two high schools.

Over the course of the year we continually met with our partners, and developed new ones, to shape this program and others. Our Flamborough Paint Challenge team never gave up on bringing the event back and their hard work paid off. With record sponsorships, and a beautiful sunny day, the event was a huge success.

What's Your Path took a new direction, inspired by a Speakers Bureau in Waterloo that one of our team members discovered. With guidance from Derek and Sherri, plus the brilliant creative mind of Sophie, and the talent of Market Mechanics, the What's Your Path Portal took shape. Set to launch in 2023, this will be another foundational program that we can continue to build on.

I continued to balance Healthy Youth Network and my Trustee role until October when I didn't seek re-election. Healthy Youth Network is my primary focus, well that and my two grandchildren, as I believe we have such an incredible future ahead of us. If we stay focused on training and equipping young people to lead change, they will take our programs to new levels and engage young people in new and creative ways. With big dreams, big plans, amazing volunteers and our growing list of partners, the stage is set for a future where all youth flourish.



elping young people refine their skills, passions & interests in order to develop a path for the future based on their priorities and goals. Through building confidence, reducing barriers, and connecting them to the resources and support they need, we will ensure young people are future-ready.



I became involved in this project (What's Your Path) many years ago. Initially, I was attracted to the project because I wanted to help youth and their families expand their views on what success looks like. In my experience, I saw a trend of families not fully understand the various pathway after high school and the rewarding occupations associated with them. I was hoping to change a prevalent mindset that university is the best and most valued pathway. I also wanted to connect students/families with stories from local people who have successful careers so they could learn from their journey and wisdom. Ultimately, it is all about helping people gain access to information and experiences to support them in making informed choices that align with who they are and what they are passionate about.

Introducing our new Whats Your Path Portal

Throughout the past year, our dedicated "What's Your Path" team determined we needed to create a new portal with it's own url **whatsyourpath.ca** that would include a "Speakers Bureau" based on a successful model in Waterloo region.

With the help of MediaBay Creative and Market Mechanics, we developed this new portal that would:

- **for Youth and Families** be a source of information, resources and support and connect them to inspirational career stories
- **for Educators** allow them to book a speaker to come into their classroom
- **for Professionals & Businesses** give them 10 ways that they can support youth to make better career decisions.



Our Programs: Ally Program

n 2021, our Youth Impact Team identified the need to address a "jock culture" that they felt added to the low percentage of female students who felt safe. With funding from WAGE Canada and 100 Women Who Care, we began working with a student team from Waterdown District High School to develop and pilot an ally program. This student team was trained in understanding GBV and helped promote and run programs such as "Be More Than A Bystander". In May 2022, they hosted their first "EmpowHER" and "EmpowerMENt" breakfasts.

This program is extremely important to our community because surveyed results show that less than 30% of female identifying youth feel safe in their school and community. Domestic violence already prevalent before COVID has also spiked during the past year during lockdown. These factors are detrimental to the health and safety of women and the health and safety of the community.

Working with a communication consultant, they developed the vision, mission and beliefs that would guide this project, renaming themselves **HEART** (**Healthy Education About Relationships Team**).

- **Vision:** A school environment that is safe for all genders, where everyone feels heard, supported and treated with equity
- **Mission:** Tackling the systemic issues in our community by raising awareness and educating youth about GBV to ensure youth have safe spaces to develop healthy relationships.
- **Purpose:** Address persistent and harmful gender stereotypes and build healthy relationships to break the gender-based violence cycle. For males (grades 7 12) to see themselves as allies in preventing violence against women.

In September 2022, we launched HEART at both Waterdown District High School and MacNab Secondary School.




